

Two all-new SS Headquarters building facades make the perfect backdrops for this thought provoking series.

# D-DWGILGE, WE

'OK, Let's go.' With these words General Eisenhower set rolling the D-Day assault on Normandy. Some 5,000 ships and 150,000 men were launched aross the English Channel as the Allies returned, at last, to north-western Europe.

ON JUNE 6, 1944 the greatest amphibious and airborne operation in history set sail and took flight for the shores of Northern France.

Codenamed 'OVERLORD', the operation was incredibly complex involving three separate Airborne Divisions as well as major divisional assaults on five different beaches.

Six decades later KING & COUNTRY is proud to commemorate the skill, courage and tenacity of the men who fought on both sides of the Normandy bocage during the long, hot summer of 1944.

Over a four-month period – May, June July and August 2004 we will launch over 20 individual sets of D.Day In DD46 two 82nd troopers link up with two from the 101st. The 'Mohawk' sergeant using the 'handie-talkie' seems to be saying, 'I know we're in France – 1 just don't know where the hell we are!"

#### BAND OF BROTHERS

Currently in production are five other K&C sets that contain US Paratroopers. Among the most popular is **DD31** 'D.Day Minus One'.

This depicts three 82nd Airborne troopers preparing themselves to board their C47 transport. Equipment is being checked... weapons carefully stowed... and most importantly, parachutes given a final 'once-over'.

#### DECEPTION

o catch the Germans by surprise and create the utmost confusion were essential to the success of D-Day. For months, the Allies had done their best to make the Germans expect a major assault against the Pas-de-Calais. On D-Day they carried the deception to its limits.

As the real invasion fleet steamed for Normandy, naval launches headed across the Channel towards Calais and Boulogne. Each towed balloons with special reflectors that produced radar echoes similar to those of large troop ships. Overhead, Lancaster bombers dropped streams of window' – strips of aluminium foil which also created false rdar images. Dummy parachutists dropped early on June 6 at points along the French coast added to the confustion.

The deception worked. German radar operators reported vast air and sea fleets approaching the Pas-de-Calais. Even after discovering this error, German commanders remained convinced until early July that the Normandy landings were a feint, and expected the real blow around Calais.





he Germans waited while the Allies prepared for 'Overload'. They knew that an invasion had to come - there was no other way for the Allies to achieve victory - but they did not know where or when.

As early as December 1941, the Fuhrer had ordered plans 'for the construction of a new West Wall to assure protection of the Arctic, North Sea and Atlantic coasts.' Work began on the Atlantic Wall in 1942, and by early 1944 block house and gun emplacements dotted the coastline of occupied Europe from the tip of Norway to the western end of France's border with Spain. Mines and obstacles covered the beaches.

The defences from the Dutch-German border to the Loire river were particularly formidable. This was the sector of Army Group B, commanded from January 1944 by Field Marshal Erwin Rommel. He planned to lay a belt of mines, nearly 1000m (over half a mile) deep, all along the coast, backed by a deeper 8 km (5 mile) belt farther inland; it would need 200 million mines. Rommel boasted that the beaches would be a 'zone of death'.

But the Atlantic Wall was still far from complete in mid-1944, and many doubted its value. 'The Wall is a myth,' asserted Rommel's superior, Field Marshal Gerd von Rundstedt, Commander in Chief West. 'Nothing in front of it, nothing behind – a mere showpiece.

The coastal front was also too long. Rundstedt lacked the resources to defend every beach and port, yet neither could he ignore any - for the Allied attack might fall at any point. The result was that no single area was adequately defended.

To make matters worse, Hitler kept moving divisions from the west to reinforce the Eastern Front, until Rundstedt's forces were largely made up of the overage, the unfit and recruits from prisoner-of-war camps.

Among the few effective troops were the six divisions of Lt General Geyr von Schweppenburg' Panzer Group West. He and Rundstedt wanted them held in

reserve near Paris, able to counterattack 'when the enemy is deeply committed'. Rommel argued that this would be too late; the only way to defeat the Allies was on the beaches. In the end Hitler ordered four divisions to stay near Paris, to be released only on his orders. It was an unsatisfactory compromise bound to delay any counterattack.

But as low-flying reconnaissance Spitfires spotted the build up of Rommel's beach defences in early 1944, the Allies began to worry. They had little need. The Germans denied aerial reconnaissance of most of southern England by Allied air supremacy and blinded by deception measure were as ignorant as ever of the time or place of the invasion.



HE MIGHTY 88.

Originally designed in 1933 as an anti-aircraft gun that could fire heavy flak more than 9 miles high (14km), the German 88mm gun first proved itself in the Battle of France in 1940.

Its fearsome reputation was further enhanced in the desert war when Rommel skillfully deployed it in the anti-tank role.

#### ROGUES' GALLERY

In addition to both of these groups are several important individual figures. Foremost among them is a standing, saluting Hitler dressed in a simple, brown-shirt uniform.

Another is the SA Chief Ernst Rohm. Once a close confidante of Hitler his political and military ambitions and growing power posed a direct threat to Hitler's leadership. In 1934 Rohm and many of his SA Leadership were arrested and shot in what became known as "the Night of the Long Knives".



Also included in this release is General of the Army, Feldmarschall Gerd von Runstedt, standing stiffly to attention while giving the traditional army salute.

Two other "personality" figures are available – Reichsmarschall Herman Goring, Chief of the Luftwaffe and "Il Duce", Benito Mussolini, Italy's Dictator and Hitler's "partner-in-crime".

Finally, an SS motorcycle escort rider completes the lineup.



#### SS BARRACKS FACADES

A dramatic backdrop to the figures is provided by the new SS Barracks Facades. These two polystone frontages comprise a Leibstandarte Headquarters façade, with entrance way and balcony plus a building annex that offers extended display possibilities.

Both facades were based on actual plans for a new Leibstandarte Headquarters that was to have been built in Berlin in 1942. Both are available singly.



#### A FINAL REMINDER...

Inevitably, Nazi figures are controversial – there are some who would ban them... forbid anyone to buy or sell them... or even to collect them.

At KING & COUNTRY we disagree, a healthy interest in all aspects of history – even the Nazi era does not mean any sympathy with their perverted ideals and evil doctrines.

We believe a wide and deeper understanding of all aspects of the past – good and bad – provides important lessons for both today and tomorrow.

#### NIGHT OF THE LONG KNIVES

By 1934 the Nazi stormtroop force, the SA or Brownshirts, had become dangerously powerful, and Hitler decided to destroy it. In the early hours of Saturday, June 30, SS officers under orders from Goring and Himmler burst into a hotel at the Bavarian lake resort of Bad Wiesee, where SA leader Ernst Rohm and a group of his men were spending the weekend. The SS men

LAH50 dragged Rohm away to Stadelheim Prison in Munich, where he was shot the next day. Other SA officers were shot on the spot. The slaughter

continued elsewhere on the Sunday. The Berlin SA leader, Karl Ernst, was seized but died loyally, shouting 'Heil Hitler'. Other scores were settled when
